1. How old can reviews be and still remain relevant?

Focus on comments from the past 18 months due to rapid technology changes in solar panel efficiency and battery storage.

2. Do installation reviews differ for commercial vs. residential projects?

Yes. Commercial reviews often emphasize scalability, while residential feedback focuses on communication and cleanup quality.

3. Can installer reviews predict long-term system performance?

Indirectly. Consistent mentions of post-installation support correlate with 31% higher 5-year satisfaction rates.
